PROGRAMS

Until this point, the initiative "Reconstruyendo México" mainly focuses on the following programs:

- Rebuilding Schools and Communities
- Re-Construye Resiliencia
- Rebuilding Schools Mapping

REBUILDING SCHOOLS AND COMMUNITIES

From the beginning, most of the effort has focused on the building of schools and community centers located in the affected zones.

The re-building of two school classrooms has now concluded, and 505 students are already studying there. Six additional schools are in the construction process, in coordination with our allies, in order for 5,106 students to be able to go back to school in the next school cycle.

RE-CONSTRUYE RESILIENCIA

This project helps infuse a culture of legality and develop resilience in high school students that had their schools destroyed after the earthquakes, through participatory projects. Until March 2018, 523 students in Mexico City have been involved, indirectly reaching 1,715 students and 131 teachers in its learning communities.

REBUILDING SCHOOLS MAPPING

More than a month has passed since the launch of the Reconstruyendo México and Instituto Mexicano para la Competitividad's initiative, which has had more than 2,658 visitors, recognized before the Federal Education Authorities.¹

This platform represents a collaboration between civil society organizations and educational authorities with the same purpose, reaching transparency and accountability in the re-construction of the educational system.
